#### 1. ACADEMICS

Our high academic standards are complemented by an exemplary curricular & co-curricular activities taught by our teachers and educators who are professionals in their fields.

The curriculum and teaching methodology ensure that every child enjoy the learning experiences and are motivated to work hard in academics with sincerity & discipline.

#### A) Curriculum

At The International School of Bombay students are diverse both in what they know and how they have learnt. Our curriculum is international with a strong emphasis on language, communications & personality development.

To support these areas, other aspects of learning are scheduled into the day. One session each for Games, Physical Education and Dance is scheduled for Physical Development. The progress of each student is monitored through observations, work sheets, work samples and shared with parents through in-depth assessment reports in Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM).

The school curriculum develops enjoyment and commitment to learning. It builds on students' strengths, interests and experiences and develops their confidence to learn and work independently and collaboratively. The curriculum equips the students with the essential learning skills of literacy, numeracy, information and communication technology, and promotes an enquiring mind with a capacity to think rationally. It also develops the students' physical skills and encourages them to recognise the importance of healthy living and keeping themselves safe. This stage prepares students for the next steps in their education and empowers them to make informed choices. It

further aims to develop their knowledge, understanding and appreciation of their own and different beliefs and cultures, and how these influence individuals.

#### v) School Readiness

There are certain parenting tips which we would like to share with you to help prepare your child for the first day at school.

- Prepare your child for the transition by talking to him/her about the school & the fun activities in the school a week prior.
- Practice being away by leaving them alone for short periods of time either with a relative or friend.
- ✓ The mode of transport is through school bus, familiarize the child with the vehicle & the driver
- ✓ Involve the child to prepare for school along with you, getting his bag ready, choosing his water bottle, discussing his snacks in the box, picking out comfortable clothes together etc. Setting a school routine from day one is important
- ✓ On the first day inform the child that ma, or pa may not be allowed to stay in the classroom for long. Reassure the child and tell the time that he/she will be picked up
- ✓ Inform the child where exactly you will be e.g., near the gate, in the office, at home etc. This helps the child feel secure.
- ✓ Use words & not bribes to encourage co-operation.
- Definitely tell him goodbye when you are ready to leave. The surprise of not having you there is
  much worse than the leaving.
- ✓ Make your goodbyes short & quick. A big smile & a quick hug & kiss are all that is required. A prolonged tight hug conveys your insecurity to the child.
- ✓ Make your child familiar with the school premises.
- The child's daily routine should be proper. The sleeping and waking up time should be well managed.
- ✓ Try to avoid late Sunday nights so that your child wakes up early, get ready in time and then can actively participate in school.
- ✓ The child should be fed something before coming to school so that he or she is energetic.

#### E) The Primary, Upper Primary, Secondary & Senior Secondary School

The Primary, Upper Primary, Secondary & Senior Secondary School curriculum is based upon the curriculum which is adapted to maximize the opportunities. Children are grouped within the class for different purposes either in ability groups or mixed ability groups depending on the objectives of each particular lesson.

Our school is a happy, lively and vibrant place which provides a friendly, safe and supportive learning environment for all our students. #### **ABOUT THE SCHOOL DIARY**

The school diary is designed to provide essential information to all our parents and students about the important school policies, processes and important dates throughout the school year. Our school diary help all our children to effectively participate in school and increase their happiness scale by being aware of the academic standards, requirements and code of conduct expected from them. The school diary is a very important medium which helps to develop effective Home & School Partnership. Parents are requested to use it as a means of effective communication with teachers

Students are required to bring this school diary to school every day. If a student loses the school diary, parents must purchase a new school diary from the school.

#### SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT, RULES & REGULATIONS

#### 1. GENERAL CONDUCT

Students are representatives of our school from leaving home until they return and are thus expected to set themselves a high standard of behaviour both inside and outside the school.

#### 2. THE SCHOOL UNIFORM, GROOMING, DRESS & APPEARANCE

School Uniform should be worn tidily and correctly both at the school and between home and school. Proper school uniform must be worn at all times. Shirts / T-Shirts are to be tucked in; socks are to be pulled up.

From Class I onwards both girls and boys are required to wear school lower for Physical Education, Yoga and Dance classes.

During winter season, students are required to wear the school sweater. Other colours and styles are not permitted.

Students are expected to dress and behave in a manner appropriate to the expectations of the school and are required to be neat and clean in their general appearance.

- It is compulsory for all the students to wear the ID-card everyday along with the uniform.
- No visible Jewellery is to be worn. Jewellery of religious or cultural significance may be worn but must be covered at all times.
- Students are not permitted to wear expensive jewellery, watches, wristbands or similar accessories. Girls may only wear one pair of earrings.
- Please avoid piercings in particular, clear plastic studs, or otherwise, used to maintain the piercing, are not allowed. Students are not permitted to come to the school with any make-up including nail polish and henna applied.
- ✓ Make-up must not be worn. Students should avoid to have visible tattoos.
- A student's hair must be kept clean and tidy at all times. Hair should not be touching the shirt collar and should be off the face. The fringe when straightened /combed down must not hang in the eyes. The colour must be the student's own natural colour; no dye nor highlights are allowed.
- ✓ Girls with hair longer than shoulder length should have their hair plaited or tied neatly. Boys should have their hair cut short.
- ✓ Students must wear black shoes that should be polished and are suitable for multiple use. These should not have any decorative features. The school prescribes plain navy blue socks of at least two inches length above the ankles without motif for all students.

#### 3. CELEBRATIONS:

#### A) Birthday Celebrations

The school recognises that birthdays are special occasions for students and parents. Chocolates, candies, lollipops or toffees may be distributed and Parents are requested not to send any fancy invitation cards, cake or take away presents/gifts for students or teachers.

On the birthdays, students may wear decent colourful clothes only upto class VIII.

#### B) Festival Celebrations

The school celebrates various festivals throughout the year. We believe that festivals bring to life the varied cultures of different segments of society and are occasions for celebration and joy.

**Special Days for Non-Uniform:** When participating in any activity, festival celebration, social function or any formal event at the school, students are required to dress appropriately and follow the guidelines set by the school through circulars. **Also please note that bare shoulders, short dresses, distressed clothing, flip-flops and beach wear are not acceptable. They have to carry set of school uniform too.**

- ✓ Mobile phones are confiscated, will be only returned at end of the session, not before in any case.
